has a Bachelor of Music in performance and an Advanced Diploma of Opera from the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, University of Sydney.



Born and raised in New Zealand but based in the UK for the last forty years, David has earned a glowing reputation worldwide for his accompanying and vocal coaching skills. His clientele includes various distinguished international singers - many of whom also frequently invite him to collaborate in recital at prestigious international venues, as well as students and vound aspiring professionals from all points of the globe.

Over the last decade David has often returned to Australasia, establishing a prominent professional profile here to complement his northern hemisphere activities. Biennial visits enable him to fulfil a variety of commitments including intermittent quest coaching periods with Opera Australia, tutorships at Summer Singing Schools, song recital engagements, and regular private vocal coaching stints in numerous locations.

David is proud to maintain his longstanding association with the IFAC Australian Singing Competition as accompanist and prize donor.

Grea Lenthen compere

Journalist and opera buff Greg Lenthen has been a stalwart of the IFAC Australian Singing Competition since it began in 1982. Over the years Greg has helped in a number of roles behind the scenes - and in front of them, too. When the fledging competition needed an honorary publicist, there was Greg.

Greg spent a decade in commercial radio as a newsreader but these days is rarely behind the microphone – except in a good cause, such as helping foster the opera stars of tomorrow though the IFAC Australian Singing Competition.

Adjudication Panel

Peter Czornyi is the Director of Artistic Planning Sydney Symphony. He studied musicology, conducting and composition at Hull University England and then Music Research at Hamburg University.

Peter was Director of the music label Archiv Produktion at Deutsche Grammophon and became the Artistic Administrator of The Cleveland Orchestra. In 2006 Peter became Vice President for Artistic Administration at the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra. In August 2008 he joined the Sydney Symphony.

Anthony Legge studied at Guildhall, Oxford University and the London Opera Centre. He has been Head of Music at English National Opera for 14 years where he conducted performances of Dido and Aeneas, Orpheus and Eurydice, Lulu, and Alcina.

Anthony was Director of Opera at the Royal Academy of Music and Music Advisor to Grange Park Opera. He has recorded two CDs with Chandos accompanying Linda Finnie, has a book published by Peters Edition, *The Art* of Auditioning, and appeared as a judge on the Channel 4 Operatunity series. His new book, written with Mary King, is The Singer's Handbook -A guide for aspiring singers.

Stephen Mould is a Senior Lecturer in Operatic Studies at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, University of Sydney.

Stephen has worked in opera houses since 1986, as a coach, musical assistant and conductor and has worked with companies in the UK, Germany, Austria, Belgium, USA, as well as 13 years with Opera Australia as Head of Music.

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National Adjudicator

Bernadette Cullen is one of Australia's

foremost mezzo sopranos. She has worked with Bayerische Staatsoper Munich, Vienna, Hamburg and Berlin Staatsopern, WNO, Scottish Opera, ROH Covent Garden, and the Prague, Palermo, the Vienna, Bergen, Budapest, NZ and Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra, as well as the Halle Orchestra. In Australia, she has been a Guest Artist with Opera Australia, Opera Queensland, WA Opera, Victoria State Opera, MSO, ASO, WASO and SSO.

She has sung all the major mezzo repertoire including Amneris, Azucena, Fricka, Venus, Ortrud, Eboli, Herodias Charlotte, Santuzza, Dido, Cassandra, Verdi Requiem, and Brahms Alto Rhapsody, with such distinguished conductors as Mackerras, Mehta, Young, de Waart, Bonynge, Rizzi. Recordings include Mahler Symphony No.2, Pulcinella and The Bohemian Girl for Decca under Richard Bonynge.
